## Murchison Place Park:

Murchison Place Park is now open—during daylight hours—for the season until October! It is located at the corner of the Dog River Road and Clyde River Road. With swings, a slide, and play equipment, it is a terrific place for young children and their parents to spend time, in the shade or in sunny spots. The boardwalk is also a popular “walking track” with seniors.

## Recreation rebate for youth

A recreation rebate of \$60/activity is available for youth 18 years and under. Youth must reside in Clyde River. All types of recreation that enhance a healthy lifestyle qualify—such as sports, theatre and music. The maximum rebate per child is \$120 for two activities per year, which runs from April 1 to March 31. ## Emergency Management Organization (EMO)

We now have a municipal emergency plan to help protect the health, safety and welfare of community members in these situations. With our recent purchase of a generator, the Riverview Community Centre is now certified as a reception centre.
